What Are the Components of Olweus?

Research based program that reduces bullying over time

Components

- Schoolwide
- Classroom
- Individual
- Parents



Schoolwide Component





Schoolwide Definition

Bullying is when someone repeatedly and on purpose says or does mean or hurtful things to another person who has a hard time defending himself or herself.



Types of Bullying

Bullying Can Take Many Forms

- Hitting
- Verbal harassment
- Spreading rumors
- Excluding
- Mean or threatening texts/emails/messages



Schoolwide Noah Webster's Rules About Bullying

- 1. We will not bully others.
- 2. We will try to help students who are bullied.
- 3. We will try to include students who are left out.
- 4. If we know that somebody is being bullied, we will tell an adult at school and an adult at home.

Classroom Component



Class Meetings

- Regular meetings
- Discuss Bullying and other topics concerning the class
- Build classroom community and trust
- Role play how to handle bullying situations



Individual Component



On the Spot Interventions

- 1) Stop the bullying
- 2) Support the student that had been bullied
- 3) Name the bullying behavior and refer to the school rules about bullying
- 4) Engage the bystanders
- 5) Impose immediate and appropriate consequences
- 6) Take steps to ensure that the bullied student will be protected from future bullying
- 7) Report incident to supervisor and classroom teacher

Follow Up

Teacher

- Use tracking sheet to see patterns and trends with students
- Talk to the student that was bullied and the student that bullies separately
- Give appropriate consequences
- Contact parents of the bullied student and the student that did the bullying
- Follow up with students separately at a later time

Bystanders

- When you see someone being bullied you are a bystander
- Most people are the bystanders of bullying
- What should you do?
 - Be an Upstander
 - Report the bullying to an adult in the area
 - Help the person being bullied



Students are recognized by Principal or Assistant Principal when staff reports that a student is being an UPSTANDER

Parent Component





Parent Partnership

- Talk to your child about the definition of bullying and the school rules about bullying
- Share concerns about bullying with your child's teacher
- Get to know your child's friends and what activities they enjoy
- Make it clear that you take bullying seriously
- If your child witnesses bullying, encourage your child to be an active bystander (UPSTANDER) by:
 - Telling an adult
 - Being a friend to the one being bullied
 - Telling the one bullying that it is not OK
