

Noah Webster Schools' Distance Learning Program

Noah Webster Schools' Distance Learning Program (NWSLDP) will include a comprehensive on-line model with instruction in core subject areas including lessons, assignments, homework, assessments and grades, along with daily attendance requirements. Please understand, this on-line program is drastically different from the remote learning offered in Spring 2020. Assessments and assignments will be graded and impact promotion and retention for the following year. Students may choose to transition to in-person learning at semester break.

All students participating in the Distance Learning Program, must have a Learning Coach at home with them throughout the school day. A Learning Coach is a parent, family member, or other adult who is at home with the student.

The role of the Learning Coach is to:

- Guide the student through the lessons, tools, and activities as needed
- Oversee assignments and help facilitate hands on learning
- Check for understanding and discuss concepts being taught
- Keep the student on schedule and on pace
- Ensure all components are done with fidelity (Independent reading, novel studies, practice activities, etc.)

Any family interested in selecting Noah Webster Schools' Distance Learning Program (on-line option) for the fall semester must contact the admissions office to indicate this option at admissions@noahwebster.org by July 22, 2020. In the email, please include all your students' name(s), parent/guardian name, campus and grade level(s). Late submissions past the July 22nd date, will not be guaranteed a spot in the on-line program. If you do not contact us, your student(s) will be enrolled in the traditional in-person option for 2020-2021. If your choice is to return to in-person classes no action is required.
